Handle:

Handle—refers to the type of handle that is affixed to a cookie cutter. **Data Boxes**—will show handles as Wood, Metal or other. Wood handles will have a number designation that corresponds with the appropriate handle shown on page #21 of this book. Metal handles, in addition to color, will be described as: SH—Self Handle, meaning a handle that is an integral part of the cutter and is not independently attached, or, as wire or 4 or 6—bend handles indicating the number of bends in the handle. Additional descriptions will include: whether the sides of the top part of the handle is rounded, or straight edged, how the handle is attached to the cutter and whether the attached ends curve out from or under the handle.

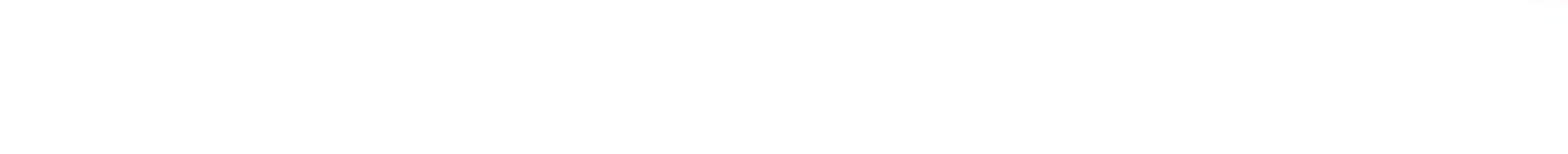

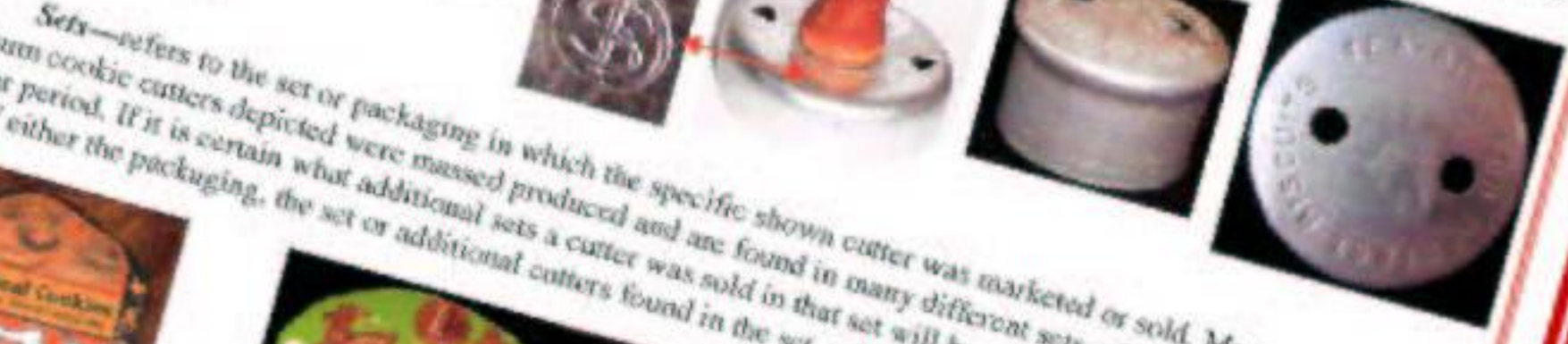

Marked:

Marked—refers to how the specific cutter is permanently marked. Photographs of markings may accompany individual cutters.



Sets:

Sets—refers to the set or packaging in which the specific shown cutter was marketed or sold. Most of the aluminum cookie cutters depicted were mass produced and are found in many different sets, often times, spanning a several year period. If it is certain what additional sets a cutter was sold in that set will be noted. Whenever possible a photograph of either the packaging, the set or additional cutters found in the set, will be included.



NOTE: The descriptive data shown on this and preceding pages is specific to the cutters shown in, “Handles, Handles...” While these terms and the identifying data will certainly apply to cookie cutters in general, it is not intended to be an all inclusive listing of all descriptive data covering all kinds and types of cookie cutters.
